
### **BRC Rationale & Purpose**


- All departments of family medicine and residency programs seek to build or sustain their research & scholarship capacity
- BRC aims to provide opportunities for all departments and residency programs to engage in a mutually beneficial learning community to leverage our strengths and resources for building research capacity



  - Brief and Extended Consultations














### Sources of Grant Funding to Departments of Family Medicine 2017 ((n=98)







### Summary

- Research capacity varies enormously among US Departments of Family Medicine
- Robust research capacity is reflected by a critical mass of investigators with external grant funding
- 3. NIH, AHRQ, PCORI, CDC and Foundations are the major sources of research grants
- 4. Only about 30% of chairs have been career researchers
- 5. And 58% of chairs are dissatisfied with the research capacity of their departments
