BECOME A COMMONWEALTH FUND FELLOW

The Commonwealth Fund Mongan Fellowship in Minority Health Policy (formerly The Commonwealth Fund/Harvard University Fellowship in Minority Health Policy, est. 1996) is now accepting applications for the 2017–18 class. This unique fellowship prepares physicians for leadership roles in transforming health care delivery systems and promoting policies and practices that improve access to high-performance health care for vulnerable populations, including racial and ethnic minorities and economically disadvantaged groups. Physicians who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents and who have completed residency and are either board-eligible or board-certified in the U.S. are eligible for the fellowship. We are seeking physicians with strong evidence of leadership experience or potential, especially as related to community efforts, quality improvement, transformation of health care delivery systems, or health policy. Applicants should also intend to pursue a career in policy, health care delivery management, public service, or academia.

Family Medicine Diabetes Faculty

The Diabetes Institute (<u>www.ohio.edu/diabetes</u>) and the Department of Family Medicine at the Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine seeks candidates for up to two tenure track Full, Associate, or Assistant Professor positions. These positions will be research intensive with limited teaching and service expectations (80% research, 10% service, 10% teaching). Qualified applicants must have demonstrated clinical, behavioral or health services research productivity related to diabetes or obesity. Consideration will be given to individuals who have performed patient-oriented or community engaged investigations.

The primary responsibilities will be to maintain an externally-funded research program in diabetes that complements a team-based, multidisciplinary approach to science in partnership with other units at the Heritage College, other units at Ohio University (e.g. College of Health Sciences and Professions and Voinovich School of Leadership and Public Affairs), and with our national and international partners.

Ohio University: Ohio University is located in Athens, OH, a historic college town with a modest cost of living in southeastern Ohio in the foothills of the Appalachian mountain range. It was founded in 1804, making it the oldest university in the Northwest Territory and ninth oldest public university in the United States. The Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine was founded in 1975 and recently expanded within the state by developing extension campuses in Dublin and Cleveland and by partnering with prominent academic health organizations.

Candidates ideally will be based at the Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine Athens campus, but senior candidates may be considered for the Dublin or Cleveland Campuses. The Heritage College has experienced unprecedented growth, based in part on a recent \$105 million transformational gift from the Osteopathic Heritage Foundations. To expand on the college's stated research and clinical objectives, the Diabetes Institute (www.ohio.edu/diabetes), seeks to recruit up to two tenure-track faculty members to expand their diabetes research programs.

Minimum Qualifications: Candidates are required to have completed a DO, MD, or PhD prior to start date of employment; have a track record of scholarship; and provide evidence of a clear plan for developing independent and/or collaborative research funding. Qualified applicants must have demonstrated clinical, behavioral or health services research related to diabetes or obesity.

Consideration will be given to candidates with postdoctoral training or mentored research training beyond

required educational degree.

Summer salary may be supplemented with additional grant support as allowed by granting agency. Additionally, Ohio University offers an excellent benefits and start-up package.
