2014, 15-year Anniversary for AHRQ Support of PBRNs



- Program has grown from ~10 Registered PBRNs in 1999
- April 2014, 157 Registered PBRNs
 - Serving 55 million Patients
 - Underrepresents actual size of PBRN community
- Summer Registration Update, join the conversation

- PBRN Network Coverage:
 - Regional: 33%
 - State: 25%
 - Local: 19%
 - National: 23%
- Types of PBRN Networks
 - Mixed Networks: 35%
 - Family Medicine Networks: 31%
 - Pediatric Networks: 13%
 - Internal Medicine Networks: 3%
 - Nursing Networks: 3%
 - Pharmacy: 3%
 - Other Networks: 11%







Number of member practices or clinics: 24,662

- Number of practices per PBRN:
 - o Average-159
 - o Median---36
- 4,984 practices with PCMH designation
- 2,757 practices pursuing PCMH designation





AHRE PBRN Capacity-Building Activities

- Opportunities to participate in developing research agenda/grant submissions (76%)
- Opportunities to co-author research presentations/publications (76%)
- Training in human subjects protection/research ethics (51%)
- Practice facilitators/coaches/QI coordinators (37%)
- Technical assistance for practice transformation efforts (e.g., PCMH, meaningful use, NCQA) (31%)
- Maintenance of Certification Part IV (20%)
