
NIH RePORTER


A useful public online search tool and database for discovering NIH-funded research projects, publications and patents. This helps to identify NIH's research portfolio and areas of interest. Through its search features, it can promote collaboration by identifying where research infrastructure grants such as CTSAs/CTRs are located.


1. Sign In to MyRePORTER to save searches, set email alerts for newly funded projects, new publications or related news.




2. Use Quick Search or the Advance Search Tool to search fields (PI names, project number, agency, etc.)



3. Hover over the "Active Funding by State" map or click on a state to view project counts, funding data and list of projects by state



4. Use the "Active Projects by Institute/Center" bar chart to see project counts and detailed listing of projects for that Institute or Center.
